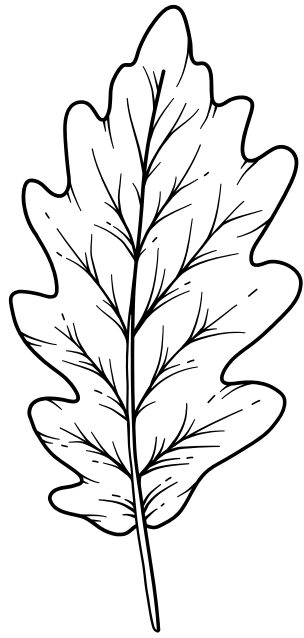


Match The Tree Leaf To The Seed

Draw a line from the tree leaf to the matching seed.

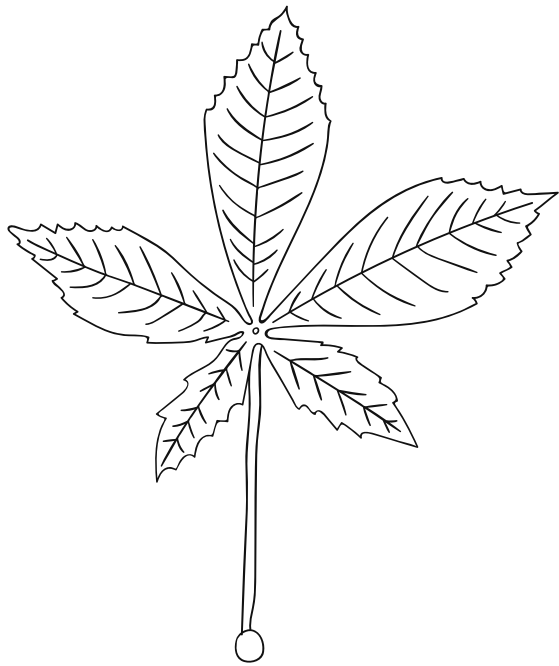

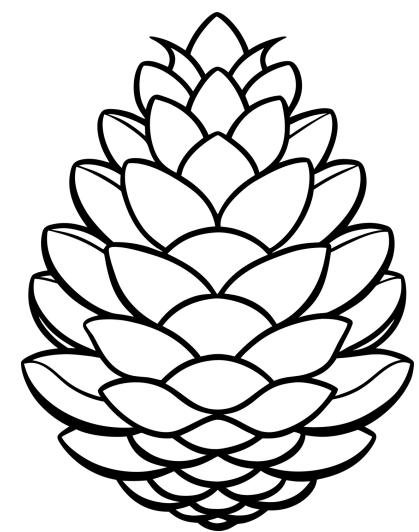

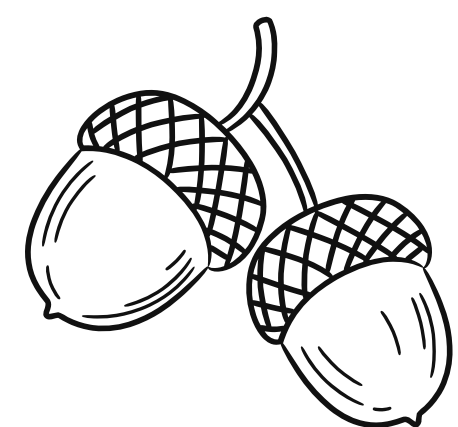

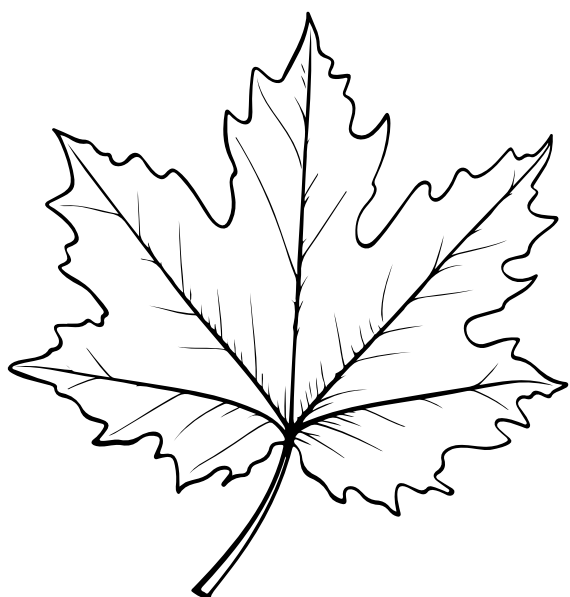

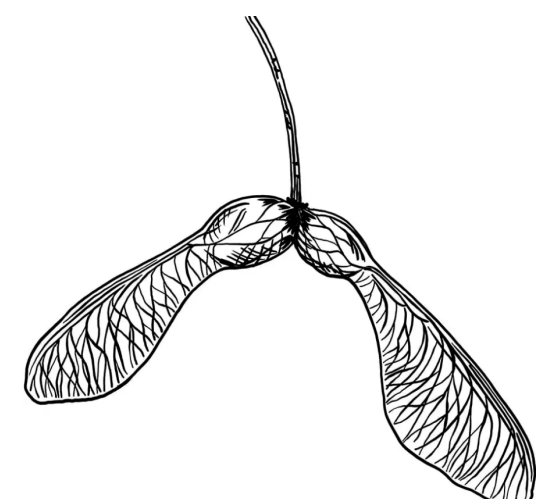

Some seeds of wisdom



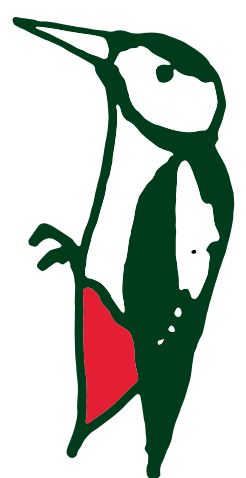
Did you know: Trees drop seeds so new trees can grow!

English oak trees have wavy leaves. They grow small, hard seeds with a cap on top which can be food for squirrels.



Horse chestnut trees have large leaves with five to seven leaflets, a bit like a fan. Their spiky green cases hold smooth, brown seeds inside. Children love collecting these seeds to play fun games!

Scots Pine have long, thin needles that grow in bunches. Pine trees make woody cones with seeds inside that can be food for birds.



Sycamore trees have large leaves which are shaped a bit like a hand, with five fingers. Sycamore trees grow seeds that spin round and round as they fall!
